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# Dr. George Fitzpatrick appointed President

The Board of Directors of the Florida State Horticultural Society (FSHS) has appointed Dr. George Fitzpatrick to the office of President of the Society, to complete the unexpired term of former President Dr. Alan Chambers, who had resigned.

Dr. Fitzpatrick was born and raised in New Jersey, and received most of his formal education there. He was awarded the BA. and M.A. degrees by The College of New Jersey in Ewing, NJ and the Ph.D. by Rutgers University in New Brunswick, NJ.

He joined the faculty at the University of Florida in 1976 and remained there for more than 35 years, retiring in 2011. At the time of his retirement, he was assigned the academic rank of Professor Emeritus. During his time at the University of Florida, he also served as a visiting instructor at the University of the Virgin Islands and the Universidad de Costa Rica.

Dr. Fitzpatrick is a long- time member of the FSHS and has served the Society in several capacities, including the Student Best Paper Judging Committee, Nominations Committee, Local Arrangements Committee, Editorial Committee (Associate Editor of the Proceedings of the FSHS during 1986 -1992, Editor during 2000-2001, Co-Editor during 2015-2018), and he also



served on the Board of Directors, as Board Member at Large, 1992-1993.

In addition to his editorial work for the FSHS, he also served as a member of the Editorial Board for the journal Compost Science and Utilization for 18 years. Dr. Fitzpatrick has also served on several committees of the American Society for Horticultural Science (ASHS), including the Collegiate Activities Committee, Horticultural Landmarks Selection Committee and the Certified Professional Horticulturist Committee. Dr. Fitzpatrick is the Editor of the Horticulturist's Certification Study Guide, published in 2013 by the American Society of Horticultural Science Press.

Since his retirement in 2011, Dr. Fitzpatrick has served as the Senior Technical Advisor at the North-South Institute, and he has been a Volunteer Tax Advisor for the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) Tax Aide Program at various sites in southern Florida, including Fort Lauderdale, North Miami, and Miami Springs. He was appointed by the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners in 2022 to the Land Acquisition Selection Committee, advising the Commissioners on sites suitable for purchase under the Environmentally Endangered Lands program.

In his free time, Dr. Fitzpatrick enjoys playing golf, woodworking, natural fiber weaving and nature, botanical and horticultural photography (he has won first place honors on two occasions in the photography competition at ASHS Annual Conferences and has provided images for several covers of the Proceedings of the FSHS).

#### MARKETING COORDINATOR

# Use of Plant Growth Regulators in the Florida Horticulture Industry

Plant growth regulators (PGRs) are substances that can be applied to influence various physiological processes in plants. PGRs can be used to manipulate flowering, vegetative growth, fruit development, and quality. The use of PGRs is a common practice in the agriculture industry. PGRs are extensively used in the horticultural industry as they are an additional tool available to growers to manipulate tree/plant physiology for better results. An IST on PGR use in the horticulture industry will help in advancing the knowledge of UF county extension faculty in assisting horticultural crop stakeholders in improving their production.
